Section-B shall consist of eight long answer type compulsory questions at least carrying two questions from each unit. The candidate shall attempt four questions by selecting one question from each unit. The upper limit for the answer of each question will be 650-750 words and each question carries 12 marks. The time duration for the End Semester Exam is 3 hours.
